Mayor Michael Canon called to order the regular meeting of the Goldendale City Council followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

PRESENTATIONS

Jay Olsen, Lions Club, Fireworks Retail Sales, Jay Olson informed the council that the Lions Club would be selling fireworks again this year.

Airport Update by Corley McFarland, Corley McFarland updated the council on the current airport project.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Police Chief Jay Hunziker, the house fire we had at the 200 Block of West Darland was ruled an accident by the investigators. Thursday June 9th is the graduation parade. GPD (Goldendale Police Department) is helping with street blocking for the parade. Every year, Legends Casino has a community contribution fund that you can apply for. We requested monies for laptops and this year we were awarded \$7500.00.

Deputy City Administrator Pat Munyan, Public Works Department received a new shipment of meters. The meters were ordered to replace some of the meters that are no longer working. Public Works has installed about a dozen. Public Works is currently replacing the red rock that we used for winter. The crew has been trying to keep up on the weed control. I am still trying to find a solution for the streetlights. I will keep you updated as that progress. We have a position opened for public works. That position will be in the Goldendale Sentinel on Wednesday. We have also put it on our website and posted it to Facebook. Because the weather hasn't been cooperating, we had to take down the flowers. The wind was beating them up so they are back at the city shop and the crew is nursing them back to health before they will be put back up. Pat gave the council an update on the treatment plant. Radcomp installed a new service for the scada system.

Council Member Steve Johnston and Council Member Filiberto Ontiveros would like us to increase our numbers at the Public Works Shop. They feel we are short on workers, and we are added more to their plate and not increasing the staff to accommodate the extra work.

COUNCIL BUSINESS

New Pump for Main Lift Station by Pat Munyan, after several year of struggling with non-consistent wastewater flow form the City's main wastewater lift station an additional base flow pump was installed in 2019 by Triangle Pump. Consistent flow is necessary to ensure that the wastewater receives optimal levels of treatment process, wastewater temperature stability as well as protecting equipment operations. The recommended pump system by Triangle Pump was a vertical pump installation. For various reasons the vertical pump installation has caused internal cavitation damaging the pump twice between 2019 and 2021. The pump has been out of commission since September of 2021 and needs replaced before peak season to ensure discharge compliance. Over the past several months City Staff has met with RH-2 Engineering to find solutions on how to rectify these issues. RH-2 has recommended a horizontal pump installation to eliminate pump cavitation for occurring to prevent damage to pump system.

Motion: I move to approve a capital outlay in the amount of \$26,314.10 for improvements to the main wastewater pump station, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Dave Jones, **Seconded by** Council Member Steve Johnston. Motion Passed Unanimously

Water Service Connection Outside City Limits by Dustin Conroy, according to the GMC 13.04.010C for connections outside the city limits, permission from the Council is required to obtain a connection permit. The City water system has the right to add connections and has adequate capacity to serve the requested connection. The water main adjacent to the parcel is of adequate size to serve the lot. The landowner will need to supply a private booster pump to serve the lot with adequate pressure if needed. The lot is within the City's water right place of use boundaries. The city currently serves other lots outside the City Limits on this mainline. Many municipalities require an annexation covenant with outside City Limit Connections, and I would recommend that an annexation covenant be a condition of approval. I would also recommend approving the water service connections for the lot contingent on the signing of the annexation covenant.

The council would like a moratorium to put on outside city limit connections until the city gets the report back showing we have adequate water supply.

I would like to see some more code enforcement being done on the tall grass and weeds, especially along the sidewalks. There are dilapidated cars parked in the street around the Catholic Church.

Council Member Filiberto Ontiveros, would like to know how prepared GPD is if we had a school shooting. Jay Hunziker gave the council an update on what GPD training they do for active shooter training through out the city.

Council Member Miland Walling, June 21, 2022, the Goldendale Chamber would like everyone to join them at the Goldendale Observatory for the Summer Solstice Celebration from 6:30pm – 9:00pm.



CITY OF GOLDENDALE GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON, TO PROVIDE AIR AMBULANCE SERVICE AS A BENEFIT TO CITY EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, COUNCIL MEMBERS AND THE MAYOR.

WHEREAS, The City of Goldendale is a beautiful rural community in the State of Washington, with a dedicated force of individuals providing services to the population of 3,459 individuals as of 2019; and

WHEREAS, Klickitat Valley Health operates a Critical Access Hospital in the city with a level 4 trauma designation by the State of Washington. Incidents involving life threatening emergencies may and often do necessitate a higher level of care, in which case patients must be transferred to hospitals with additional capabilities; and

WHEREAS, The Goldendale City Council understands that the city's most valuable assets are its employees, who provide essential services to city residents and who have been completing work through hazardous weather events and a worldwide pandemic.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Unless otherwise negotiated, effective the date this ordinance, City employees shall be provided by the City of Goldendale, at no cost to the employee, a one-year membership for an air ambulance service selected by the City at its discretion. This benefit shall be provided to full-time employees employed by the City on the date this ordinance becomes effective. Said membership shall be renewed for additional one-year terms for as long as the employee is employed by the City of Goldendale on the date the prior one-year agreement is terminated.

- Section 2. Full-time employees hired after the effective date of this ordinance shall be entitled to the benefit described in Section 1 following employment with the City for a period of 30 days.
- Section 3. Current volunteers for the City of Goldendale Fire Department, reserve officer volunteers for the Goldendale Police Department and other city government enrolled volunteers, as determined by the City Administrator, shall be entitled to the benefit described in Section 1. Volunteers who begin service with the city after the effective date of this ordinance shall be entitled to the benefit described in Section 1 only

after the volunteer has been on active volunteer status for a period of 1 year as determined by the City Administrator.

<u>Section 4</u>. Current Councilmembers and the Mayor shall not be entitled to the benefit described in Section 1. However, current Councilmembers and the Mayor shall be eligible to participate at their own expense in an air ambulance service group discount negotiated by the city.

Section 5. Following the expiration of each council term and mayoral term in effect on the day this ordinance becomes effective, a Councilmember and/or Mayor who takes office shall be entitled to the benefit described in Section 1 after the Councilmember or Mayor has held his or her position for one year and said benefit shall be renewed so long as the Councilmember or Mayor retains their position.
