Mayor Michael Canon called to order the regular meeting of the Goldendale City Council followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Staff Present (Not Voting): City Administrator Larry Bellamy, Fire Chief Noah Halm, Police Chief Jay Hunziker, Deputy Clerk Treasurer Sandy Wells, Deputy City Administrator Patrick Munyan

Motion: I move to excuse Council Member Loren Meagher and Council Member Filiberto Ontiveros, Action: Motion, Moved by Council Member Steve Johnston, Seconded by Council Member Ellie Casey Motion Passed Unanimously

AGENDA AND CONSENT AGENDA

Motion: I move to approve the agenda and consent agenda, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Miland Walling, **Seconded by** Council Member Andy Halm. Motion Passed Unanimously with discussion.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Police Chief Jay Hunziker, informed the council about the hiring process the police department is starting to replace the two officers that they lost. Right now, the police department is at 1472 call for the year. Council Member Steve Johnston would like the calls broke down in type of calls. Chief will bring in a report at the next council meeting.

Fire Chief Noah Halm, the burn ban is in effect. The 4th of July is coming up. We are encouraging residents to mow their tall grass and weeds. The 4th of July is the only day you can set off fireworks in the city limits. They are allowed from 6:00 pm to Midnight 12:00 am. Council Member Miland Walling would like to see more residents mow their tall grass and weeds.

Deputy City Administrator Pat Munyan, currently the staff is low on Public Works. The Dino Mart sewer line has separated from the service line and staff is investigating. The low bid contractor for the Airport is unable to preform the work. Currently we are

working with legal counsel on both sides of the contract. At the next council meeting we will present our options to you for the council to decide how we are going to proceed.

Pat gave the council an update on the Byers Street project.

COUNCIL BUSINESS

Outside City Limits Water Service Connection by Pat Munyan, at the prior City Council meeting the legislative body raised concerns with authorizing outside city limits water service connect and their potential impacts. City Council requested staff to review and/or provide a method of review for each outside City limits service connection to ensure that the allowance of said connections will not have a significant impact on the water distribution system. The city staff recommend that each outside City limits service connection request be submitted with an engineer report addressing potential impacts.

NO MOTION, City council concurs to hold abeyance on future water connections outside of City limits, subject to an affirmative engineering report indicating impacts to the city water supply and system would be minimal. Pending the outcome of an engineering report the City Council hold the right to make their decision with or without bias.

Council Member Steve Johnston would like to see regular Public Works committee meetings

ORDINANCES

Air Ambulance Service as a Benefit by Larry Bellamy, this matter was discussed at the last council meeting. No changes were made, and it is ready for its second reading.

City Administrator, **Larry Bellamy**, gave an update to the council on his REDS committee meeting. Goldendale is collecting information on the rates study performed by FCS Group. That rate study is part of the Wastewater Treatment Plant project. We had a discussion with the Office of the Columbia River regarding water supply. They have a grant program that they are trying to develop and get ready for the 2023 budget cycle. They are looking for projects the city might have that they can put some grant money towards.

The Goldendale Energy Storage Project is presenting a draft environment impact statement. A Public Hearing in Goldendale is scheduled for June 28, 2022 at 6:30 pm. That project is opened for comments and all comments will be accepted until July. **Council Member Andy Halm**, I wanted to wish everyone happy pride month. We are having an annual pride event on July 23rd.

Council Member Miland Walling, Miland gave an update and comment on the airport project.

Council Member Dave Jones, I would like to address the letter that all the council received. We received a letter from Mr. Harris regarding community days hours of music. Larry Bellamy, we had a meeting the chief regarding this topic, and we agreed that outside bands can play until 11:00 pm. Dave Jones, that sounds good. It's not too late to get your ideas in the time capsule. If anyone has anything they would like to put in the time capsule, drop your items or ideas off to me.

Council Member Steve Johnston, I think a good idea for the time capsule would be a high school annual. Steve thinks the REDS group is a good opportunity for us to utilize.

Mayor Mike Canon, wanted to thank the time capsule committee for all their hard work.

A Premises

TEMPORARY LICENSE AGREEMENT

This Temporary License Agreement ("Agreement") is made and deemed effective as of July 1ST, 2022 between the undersigned, **Washington State University**, an institution of higher education and agency of the State of Washington, by and through its College of Agricultural, Human and Natural Resource Sciences ("Licensee"), and City of Goldendale, Washington (Licensor) for purposes of specifying terms and conditions applicable to Licensee's use of Licensor's property and/or facilities.

1) Premises.

Approximately 1024 square feet of land located at the Goldendale Wastewater Treatment, as described in Exhibit A.

- (b) Licensee acknowledges and agrees the area described in Exhibit A may change depending on the needs of the Parties, in which case an alternate location may be provided.
- 2) **Permitted Use.** The Licensor hereby grants a license to Licensee to occupy, install and maintain weather and soil/hydrology related monitoring equipment (the "Equipment"). The Property shall be used for no other purpose whatsoever, other than to access the Equipment for regular servicing and occasional emergency repairs as needed. Licensee shall not use or allow the Property to be used for any purpose that is objectionable or offensive in the Licensor's reasonable judgment or is unlawful. Licensee shall comply with all regulations and best management practices to prevent illicit discharge of non-storm water. No heavy equipment cleaning, maintenance, fueling, or storage will be performed on the Property.
- 3) **Term.** The term of this Agreement shall commence on or about 01 July 2022 and shall continue until terminated by either Party with at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior written notice
- 4) Consideration.
- (a) **Consideration for Temporary Use**. In consideration for the temporary use described in this Agreement, the Licensor shall be allowed access to weather information provided by the Equipment.
- (b) **Expenses.** Licensee shall be responsible for any expenses the Licensor incurs related to Licensee's use of the Property. Expenses may include, but are not limited to:
 - i. Cement pad
 - ii. Ground leveling
- 5) General Terms and Conditions.
- (a) Acceptance of Property. Licensee is familiar with the Property described and Licensee has determined, based on Licensee's sole evaluation that the subject Property is suitable for Licensee's intended purpose. Licensees' right to occupy and use property includes the rights of ingress and egress to the described tract in Exhibit A, on, and over any contiguous or adjacent land owned by Licensor. Further, it is Licensee's sole responsibility to properly secure any property in such a manner that there will be no damage to any property, including without limitation property of the Licensor.

- (b) **Access to Property.** Licensee shall be given any gate code or key for access to the Property.
 - 1. Primary Route Access
 - 2. Alternate Route Access
- (c) Safe Operations within Airport Operational Area. At such times when Licensee's operations require accessing the adjacent secured airport operational area, all vehicles and personnel shall use caution to ensure their own personal safety as well as that of all airport users and tenants, particularly when traveling through active aircraft apron areas. Under no circumstances shall Licensee be granted access to the active taxiways and runway. Licensee's operations shall not interfere in any way with aircraft operations. Licensee shall prevent any operation which would produce electromagnetic radiations of a nature which would cause interference with any air navigational or communications aid now or in the future to be installed to serve the Anacortes Airport, or which would create any interfering or confusing light or cause any restrictions to visibility at the airport
- (d) **Maintenance of Property and Termination.** Maintenance and repair of the Property is the sole responsibility of the Licensee. Licensee agrees to construct and maintain creditable and sufficient fence around the station. Licensee further agrees to leave the property in a similar condition to which was found upon termination, apart from the concrete slab installed for the weather station. Removal of said concrete could cause additional damage to the Property.
- (e) **Compliance with Laws.** Licensee and any agent, contractor, subcontractor, visitor, invitee, or guest of Licensee shall always, observe all laws, statutes, ordinances, and governmental rules and regulations and policies whether of the Port or other applicable jurisdiction. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing requirements, Licensee shall comply with all applicable air and water pollution control and prevention laws, regulations and state and federal air pollution and water pollution control agencies' recommendations in the maintenance of the Property used
- (f) Hazardous and Toxic Substances. Licensee represents, warrants and covenants that throughout the term of this Agreement, no chemical, substance, material or waste or component thereof which is now or hereafter listed, defined or regulated as a hazardous or toxic chemical, substance, material or waste or component thereof by any federal, state or local governing or regulatory body having jurisdiction ("Hazardous Substances") will be improperly generated, treated, released, stored or disposed of, or otherwise deposited in or on the Property, and there will be no Hazardous Substances or hazardous conditions in or on the Property which may support a claim or cause of action under any federal, state or local environmental laws.

Licensee has confirmed the lack of toxicity of weed spray that will be used for ongoing plant control, i.e., weeds, grasses, etc.

(g) Indemnification and Hold Harmless. To the extent permitted by Washington law and the limitations of coverage under the Washington State Agency Self-Insurance Program, Licensor shall hold harmless a cause of action against Licensees, their regents, officers, agents, students, and employees for any and all claims, demands, damages, fines, penalties, losses, expenses, liabilities, costs, and fees of any nature (e.g., attorney's fees) including, but not limited to, bodily injury, illness, product liability and property damage arising from Licensees' use of Licensor's land as depicted in Exhibit A. Licensor shall not be responsible for any inspection, maintenance, replacement or repair of said land or equipment, machinery, facilities and/or

fixtures of Licensees. Provided, should Licensor discover damage or loss to such equipment, machinery, facilities, and/or fixtures, or when they appear to be in danger of damage or loss, Licensor will immediately notify Licensees of same.

This duty to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless specifically excludes any damage or injury or death caused by the negligence of the Licensor, its employees, agents, or representatives.

- 6) Insurance. Licensee and its officers, employees, and agents, while acting in good faith within the scope of their official duties, are covered by the State of Washington Self-Insurance Program and the Tort Claims Act (RCW 4.92.060 et seq.), and successful claims against Licensee and its employees, officers, and agents in the performance of their official duties in good faith under this Agreement will be paid from the tort claims liability account as provided in RCW 4.92.130. Coverage includes limits of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury, property damage, and personal injury. Evidence of coverage will can be provided to Licensor prior to execution of this agreement.
- 7) Assignment. This Agreement is personal to the Licensee and may not be transferred, assigned, subleased, or shared with any third party.
- 8) Amendment. No modification, termination or amendment of this Agreement may be made except by written agreement signed by all parties, except as provided herein.
- 9) Not an Interest in the Property. This Agreement is not a lease, nor does it assign any interest whatsoever in the Property to Licensee. This Agreement shall not be recorded with the County Auditor's Office and shall not be considered a lien or encumbrance on title.
- 10) Notices. All notices, demands, requests, consents and approvals which may, or are required to be given by any party to any other party hereunder, shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally, sent by facsimile, sent by a nationally recognized overnight delivery service, or if mailed or deposited in the United States mail and sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid to:

Goldendale Tax Increment Financing Feasibility Analysis Scope of Work

Objective: Determine the RCW 39.114.020 regulatory requirements for establishing a tax increment area within the City of Goldendale. Identify draft increment area(s) and evaluate potential value creation and supportable debt, impacts on affected taxing districts, and potential use of funds.

Task 1. Key Assumptions

At the beginning of the project, FCS GROUP will attend an initial "kickoff" video conference with the City's project team. Ideally, this meeting would include representatives from departments that address financial, engineering, planning and administrative issues. This meeting will establish a foundation for the project, focusing the efforts of the project team. It will cover the project scope, objectives, deliverables, schedule, and appropriate lines of communication.

The initial meeting will discuss and identify baseline assumptions regarding:

- Preliminary Boundaries for the Increment Area
- Current and Future Anticipated Development Conditions withing the Increment Area
- Public Improvements Needed and Related Capital Cost Assumptions

Deliverables

- Updated project schedule with task completion and key milestone review points.
- Meeting Notes that describe initial project assumptions.

Task 2. Alternatives Analysis

The alternatives analysis enables the City to plan for the future proactively by evaluating and quantifying the sensitivity associated with changes in the underlying assumptions. It is a tool that the City can use to craft a TIF district to meet its short and long-term objectives, including (but not limited to) fiscal sustainability and affordability.

As part of this task, FCS with conduct research and interviews of other jurisdictions in WA state and compile/review supporting ordinance findings. We will summarize lessons learned from these jurisdictions in a Task 2 Memorandum.

FCS will prepare a multi-year financial analysis that addresses the following RCW 39.114.020 regulatory requirements:

- The increment area(s) may not have an assessed valuation of more than \$200,000,000 or more than 20 percent of the City's total assessed valuation, whichever is less, when the ordinance is passed;
- The public improvements proposed to be paid or financed with tax allocation revenues are expected to encourage private development within the increment area and to increase the assessed value of real property within the increment area;
- Private development that is anticipated to occur within the increment area as a result of the
 proposed public improvements will be permitted consistent with the permitting jurisdiction's
 applicable zoning and development standards;
- The private development would not reasonably be expected to occur solely through private investment within the reasonably foreseeable future without the proposed public improvements; and

The increased assessed value within the increment area that could reasonably be expected to
occur without the proposed public improvements would be less than the increase in the
assessed value estimated to result from the proposed development with the proposed public
improvements.

Deliverables

- Memorandum identifying increment area alternatives analysis and lessons learned from other jurisdictions.
- Project Review Video Conference with City representatives.

Task 3. Draft Feasibility Report Findings

FCS will prepare a report that documents key project assumptions, analysis results, findings and next steps. The report will address RCW 39.114.020 regulatory requirements for establishing a tax increment area within the City of Goldendale, including:

- (a) A statement of objectives of the local government for the designated increment area;
- (b) A statement as to the property within the increment area, if any, that the local government may intend to acquire;
- (c) The duration of the increment area;
- (d) Identification of all parcels to be included in the area;
- (e) A description of the expected private development within the increment area, including a comparison of scenarios with the proposed public improvements and without the proposed public improvements;
- (f) A description of the public improvements, estimated public improvement costs, and the estimated amount of bonds or other obligations expected to be issued to finance the public improvement costs and repaid with tax allocation revenues;
- (g) The assessed value of real property listed on the tax roll as certified by the county assessor under RCW <u>84.52.080</u> from within the increment area and an estimate of the increment value and tax allocation revenues expected to be generated;
- (h) An estimate of the job creation reasonably expected to result from the public improvements and the private development expected to occur in the increment area; and
- (i) An assessment of any impacts and any necessary mitigation to address the impacts identified on the following:
 - Affordable and low-income housing;
 - The local business community;
 - The local school districts; and
 - The local fire service.
