### INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE AND KLICKITAT COUNTY FOR DISTRICT COURT SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2025 by and between the CITY OF GOLDENDALE, a municipal corporation, hereinafter called "City" and KLICKITAT COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Washington, hereinafter called "County."

WHEREAS, the County has an established District Court System; and

WHEREAS, the city has been utilizing the services of East District Court for many years with an interlocal agreement; and

WHEREAS, in 2023 the County has requested that the pro rata share paid by the city is expanded to include the salary and benefits of the Judge and salaries and benefits of East District Court personnel; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Interlocal Agreement is to set for the terms of usage of East District Court by the City pursuant to RCW 39.34.180;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT AGREED by and between the parties as follows:

(1) East District Court Services. The County and its District Court shall furnish to the City the facilities and services of the East District Court for all cases wherein the City is the plaintiff in the East District Court, over which the East District Court has jurisdiction, for purposes of enforcing violation of state statutes or city ordinances committed by persons within the City's jurisdiction that constitute gross misdemeanors, misdemeanors, or civil infractions. Nothing in this Agreement shall permit the City to regulate the administration of the court.

### (2) Compensation.

- (a) <u>Calculation of Percentage of Usage.</u> The parties have determined, and do hereby agree, that in return for facility usage and services of the District Court, the City shall pay the County, the City's pro rata share of the total costs of the salaries and benefits of the East District Court judge and courtroom personnel. The Washington State Caseload Reports will be the source for this utilization. The pro rata share shall be an amount equal to the ratio of the total number of violations filed wherein the City is the plaintiff, whether infractions or criminal violations, to the total number of (1) violations filed by all jurisdictions in East District Court, plus (2) felony complaints filed in East District Court, plus (3) small claims cases filed, plus (4) civil cases filed, plus (5) civil protection orders, plus (6) petitions for antiharassment orders, plus (7) parking infractions.
- (b) Costs to be Allocated by Percentage. The total costs allocated by paragraph (2)(a) above shall include, but are not limited to, and the salaries and benefits of the East District Court judge, salaries and benefits of the East District Court personnel for the adopted budget year, excluding (i) the costs of public defense for criminal defendants in East District Court; and (ii) the costs of housing of prisoners that are reflected in a separate budget line and in agreement with the Klickitat County Sheriff's Office.
- (c) <u>Time Period for Determining Percentage</u>. The ratio described above in paragraph (2) (a) shall for each year be determined by the average percentage of the City of Goldendale's previous 3 years of total Court filings.
- (3) **Billings.** The County will invoice the City quarterly for the City's pro rata share of the agreed-upon figure for the calendar year. All sums due to the County shall be paid within thirty (30) days of mailing such invoice, via regular mail or electronic mail.

- Obstributions of Revenues to the City. All money received by the East District Court pursuant to court action in a case filed by the City, including penalties, fines, bail forfeitures, fees and costs, except as otherwise prohibited herein, shall be paid by the East District Court to the City; provided that the County may retain all money received as payments of assessments for probation costs ordered in the City's cases. The City shall not be entitled to any revenue received by East District Court other than revenues received pursuant to court action in a case filed by the City.
- (5) **Term.** This Agreement shall be effective upon execution by the parties and recording with the Klickitat County Auditor and shall remain in effect through December 31, 2027, unless earlier terminated pursuant to the terms of this Agreement or extended by written amendment. The Parties will negotiate the cost of East District Court Services every two (2) years. The County is responsible for sending a proposal to the City no later than February 15, 2027.
- (6) Termination and Notice of Termination. This Agreement is terminable by either party without cause if such party provides written notice of intent to terminate in accordance with RCW 3.50.810 and 35.20.010. Any such notice from the City must be received by the Chairperson of the Klickitat County Board of County Commissioners by the statutorily required date, and any such notice from the County must be received by the Mayor of the City by the statutorily required date.
- (7) Ownership of Property. All real and personal property used in the operation of East District Court has been and shall continue to be acquired by the County, owned by the County and may be disposed of at the discretion of the County.
- (8) Waiver of Binding Arbitration. Provided that this Agreement is not earlier terminated pursuant to the terms stated above, this Agreement will expire on December 31, 2027, unless a written renewal Agreement is executed prior to such date. The City and the County waive and release any right to invoke binding arbitration under RCW 3.62.070, 35.20.010, 39.34.180 or other applicable law as related to this Agreement, any extension or amendment of this Agreement, or any discussions or negotiations relating thereto.
- (9) Indemnification Regarding City Ordinances. The City agrees that the County does not assume any liability or responsibility for or release the City from any liability or responsibility which arises in whole or in part from the existence or effect of City ordinances, rules or regulations, policies or procedures as well as any and all cases filed by the Municipal Prosecutor and/or cited by members of City Police Departments. If any cause, claim, suit, action or administrative proceeding is commenced in which the enforceability and/or validity of any City ordinance, rule, regulation, policy or procedure is at issue or conduct or acts of Municipal Prosecutor and/or City Police Departments the City shall defend the same at its sole expense and if judgment is entered or damages are awarded against the City, the County, or both, the City shall satisfy the same, including all chargeable costs and attorney fees. This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- (10) General Indemnification. The City and the County each agree to defend and indemnify the other and its elected and appointed officials, officers, employees and agents against all claims, losses, damages, suits, and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, to the extent they arise out of, or result from, the negligence or willful misconduct of the indemnitor or its elected or appointed officials, officers, employees and agents in the performance of this Agreement. The indemnitor's duty to defend and indemnify extends to claims by the elected or appointed officials, officers, employees or agents of the indemnitor or of any contractor or subcontractor or indemnitor. The indemnitor waives its immunity under Title 51 of the Revised Code of Washington solely for the purpose of this provision and acknowledges that this waiver was mutually negotiated. This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- (11) **Captions.** The paragraph and subsection captions used in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not control or affect the meaning or construction of any provisions of this Agreement.
- (12) Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains the entire Agreement and understanding of the parties with

respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all prior oral or written understandings, agreements, promises or other undertakings between the parties, including but not limited to the interlocal agreement executed by the parties in 2009 for District Court Services.

- (13) Governing Law. This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws and court rules of the State of Washington in effect on the date of execution of this Agreement. ### RCW 39.34.180

### Criminal justice responsibilities—Interlocal agreements—Termination.

- (1) Each county, city, and town is responsible for the prosecution, adjudication, sentencing, and incarceration of misdemeanor and gross misdemeanor offenses committed by adults in their respective jurisdictions, and referred from their respective law enforcement agencies, whether filed under state law or city ordinance, and must carry out these responsibilities through the use of their own courts, staff, and facilities, or by entering into contracts or interlocal agreements under this chapter to provide these services. Nothing in this section is intended to alter the statutory responsibilities of each county for the prosecution, adjudication, sentencing, and incarceration for not more than one year of felony offenders, nor shall this section apply to any offense initially filed by the prosecuting attorney as a felony offense or an attempt to commit a felony offense. The court of any county, city, or town that wishes to offer probation supervision services may enter into interlocal agreements under subsection (6) of this section to provide those services.
- (2) The following principles must be followed in negotiating interlocal agreements or contracts: Cities and counties must consider (a) anticipated costs of services; and (b) anticipated and potential revenues to fund the services, including fines and fees, criminal justice funding, and state-authorized sales tax funding levied for criminal justice purposes.
- (3) If an agreement as to the levels of compensation within an interlocal agreement or contract for gross misdemeanor and misdemeanor services cannot be reached between a city and county, then either party may invoke binding arbitration on the compensation issued by notice to the other party. In the case of establishing initial compensation, the notice shall request arbitration within thirty days. In the case of nonrenewal of an existing contract or interlocal agreement, the notice must be given one hundred twenty days prior to the expiration of the existing contract or agreement and the existing contract or agreement remains in effect until a new agreement is reached or until an arbitration award on the matter of fees is made. The city and county each select one arbitrator, and the initial two arbitrators pick a third arbitrator. This subsection does not apply to the extent that the interlocal agreement is for probation supervision services.
- (4) A city or county that wishes to terminate an agreement for the provision of court services must provide written notice of the intent to terminate the agreement in accordance with RCW 3.50.810 and 35.20.010. This subsection does not apply to the extent that the interlocal agreement is for probation supervision services. The city or county shall provide a copy of the written notice to terminate an agreement for the provision of court services to the administrative office of the courts not less than one year prior to the expiration of the agreement.
- (5) For cities or towns that have not adopted, in whole or in part, criminal code or ordinance provisions related to misdemeanor and gross misdemeanor crimes as defined by state law, this section shall have no application until July 1, 1998.
- (6) Municipal courts or district courts may enter into interlocal agreements for pretrial and/or postjudgment probation supervision services pursuant to ARLJ 11. Such agreements shall not affect the jurisdiction of the court that imposes probation supervision, need not require the referral of all supervised cases by a jurisdiction, and may limit the referral for probation supervision services to a single case. An agreement for probation supervision services is not valid unless approved by the presiding judge of each participating court. The interlocal agreement may not require approval of the local executive and legislative bodies unless the interlocal agreement requires the expenditure of additional funds by the jurisdiction. If the jurisdiction providing probation supervision services is found liable for inadequate supervision, as provided in RCW 4.24.760(1), or is impacted by increased costs pursuant to the interlocal agreement, the presiding judge of the jurisdiction imposing probation supervision shall consult with the executive authority of the jurisdiction imposing probation supervision and determine whether to terminate the interlocal agreement for probation supervision services. All proceedings to grant, modify, or revoke probation must be held in the court that imposes probation supervision. Jail costs and the cost of other sanctions remain with the jurisdiction that imposes probation supervision.

The administrative office of the courts, in cooperation with the district and municipal court judges association and the Washington association of prosecuting attorneys, shall develop a model interlocal agreement.

### INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

### **BETWEEN**

Klickitat County and the City of Goldendale

For

The Distribution of Surface Transportation Program Funding Within Klickitat County Appropriated Under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Klickitat County ("County") and City of Goldendale ("City"), and each are a party to this agreement.

WHEREAS, a legacy for users (IIJA), enacted November 15, 2021 as Public Law 117-59; and

WHEREAS, appropriations from the act fund the Surface Transportation Program (STP); and

WHEREAS, the expenditure of STP funds must be administered by WSDOT or a "Certification Acceptance Agency"; and

WHEREAS, the most efficient use of STP funds will be realized of Klickitat County continues to buy STP funds from each city municipality using county road funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, under the provisions and intent of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, RCW 39.34 and in consideration of the mutual benefits contained herein, the member municipality agree as follows:

### **SECTION I - DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS**

Funds shall be distributed to each incorporated city based on 25% by population and 75% by mileage. Population shall be determined by the most current publication of the Office of Financial Management, State of Washington. Mileage shall be based on the Major Collector classification as approved by WSDOT.

### SECTION II - SALE/PURCHASE OF FUNDS

The City agrees to trade to County on a dollar-for-dollar basis their distributed amount. County agrees to accept the distribution and expend these funds in conformance with "Certification Acceptance" procedures. The funds traded to the City shall be expended only for purposes described in Section III.

### **SECTION III - USE OF FUNDS**

The City agrees to expend traded funds for transportation improvement purposes only. The Cities highest priority shall be to use these funds to leverage and/or match other funding sources. This includes priority for transportation projects that serve more than one jurisdiction.

### **SECTION IV - PAYMENT TO CITIES**

The payment to the City shall be made yearly following the County's receipt of the STP funds from WSDOT. The payment to cities will be a percentage of STP funds received by the County as shown by the following table.

### **SECTION V - ADVANCE TO CITIES**

The City shall be allowed to petition the Board of County Commissioners for an advance payment expected to be received during a succeeding twelve-month period. Interest on the amount advanced will be accrued at the rate of 5.7%. The cities agree to return any portion of the advance plus accrued interest not eventually earned through this agreement.

### **SECTION VI - EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION**

This agreement shall become effective immediately upon signature of all parties and shall remain in effect for five (5) years.

### SECTION VII – ADMINISTRATION AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION

There shall be no separate legal entity created by this agreement. In the event of a dispute under this agreement the City and County shall attempt to resolve the matter informally. If the City and County are unable to resolve the matter informally the matter may be referred to non-binding mediation. Each party shall be responsible for their own costs and share the costs of the mediator equally.

In the event that any litigation should arise concerning the construction or interpretation of any of the terms of this agreement, the venue of such action shall be in the courts of the State of Washington in and for Klickitat County. The agreement shall be governed by the law of the State of Washington. Each party shall be responsible for its own attorney fees.

### VIII - INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Nothing herein shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee, or principal and agent between City and County or any of the employees or agents of either party. City and County shall comply with all relevant Federal, State, and municipal laws, rules and regulations. Nothing in this agreement shall make an employee of City an employee of County or an employee of County an employee of City for any purpose.

### IX- HOLD HARMLESS/INDEMNIFICATION

Each party agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the other, its officials, employees and volunteers from any and all liability, demands, claims, causes of action, suits or judgments including costs, attorney fees and expenses, arising out of or resulting from the negligent acts, errors or omissions of the parties relating to or arising out or in connect with, or incident to, its negligent acts or omissions under this agreement.

# 2025 LODGING TAX FUNDS GENERAL INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS

The City of Goldendale has established the Event Committee to support tourism promotion projects within the City of Goldendale. The purpose is to provide funding to eligible organizations or groups for the purpose of positively impacting tourism in the City of Goldendale. Pursuant to RCW 67.28.1817, funding and specific awards are dependent on recommendations of the Event Committee and final decision by the City Council. The City Council may allocate all, none, or a portion of the available funds.

The Event Committee is accepting proposals for tourism related services to be provided during the 2025 calendar year and funded by revenue from the City's lodging tax. Lodging taxes available for 2025 are estimated to be \$80,000. Selected proposals will be based on their emphasis and ability to create events and activities that will result in positive user impacts on lodging, restaurants, and retail markets in the City of Goldendale.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The lodging tax is an existing (sales tax) authorized by Washington State law in RCW 67.28, Public Stadium, Convention, Arts and Tourism Facilities. The City of Goldendale receives revenue from the Washington State Revenue Department under a special Hotel-Motel Tax. The tax is a charge placed on consumers for lodging at hotels, motels, rooming houses, private campgrounds, recreational vehicle parks, and similar facilities for continuous periods of less than one month.

Funding for this program comes from the City of Goldendale Tourism Fund which receives hotel/motel taxes from lodging establishments from inside the city limits. The city collects a four percent tax on charges for overnight lodging 2% is considered a basic hotel/motel tax and the second 2% is a credit against the sales tax that lodging establishments collect.

The City of Goldendale considers lodging tax funded proposals from public agencies and <u>non-profit</u> <u>organizations</u>. Proposals must completely address the questions in the application, and all requested supplemental information must be provided.

#### **EVENT COMMITTEE ALLOCATION EVALUATION CRITERIA**

The criteria listed below constitute the standards by which applications for funding from the Lodging Tax Fund are judged. In some cases, by their nature, some applicant events, activities, programs, organizations and facilities will not be able to meet all criteria. However, the more criteria met the stronger the application.

#### Community Economic Impact

Potential positive economic impact of tourism on the community is a significant benefit that can be measured. In its most fundamental effect, tourism impacts the community's economy through the dollars brought to and spent in the City of Goldendale. Overnight stays generate more revenue than day visits.

The total impact can be measured in terms of direct dollar expenditures made by the visitors themselves and indirect dollar expenditures made as the money moves through the community. In evaluating applications in this area, more weight will be given to direct expenditures as they are more readily measurable.

In assessing the probable economic impact of the proposal, the Committee will consider: (a) The estimated number of visits to be generated; (b) The estimated number of overnight stays to be generated; (c) The duration of the event, activity or program; (d) The event's generation of economic activity during off-peak tourism seasons or periods; (e) The use of local firms and resources in the proposed event, activity, program or facility; and (f) New or first time events or activities.

## Resources Available for Event or Facility

The applicant should identify other community capital and/or labor sources to ensure project success. Each year applications submitted for funding proposal is not guaranteed for subsequent years.

Providing seed money that will help establish the activity, program, event, organization, or facility which will later function successfully on its own are preferred.

# **Builds on Identified Community Assets**

Community assets include natural amenities, facilities, festivals, events and activities that distinguish the City of Goldendale in the region, state and nation. Those things both help constitute and promote the County's positive image.

# **Meets Community Objectives**

Events, projects, activities, and facilities that also serve the broader community will be given preference. The Committee will assess whether the proposal furthers the success of and coordinates with scheduled community events, facilities, and community promotion and marketing efforts.

# Meets the Requirements of the Lodging Tax Law RCW 67.28.080 & 67.28.1815

Information on the requirements can be found on the Washington State Legislature website at: http://apps.leg.wa.gov/rcw/\_Committee will only consider proposals meeting statutory requirements.

# ADDITIONAL GUIDELINES & REQUIREMENTS

# Eligibility

Each applicant will concisely define the project or event to be pursued and demonstrate how it will do so. The project or event must be in compliance with Washington State statutes and the City of Goldendale guidelines established in this program.

# Project Description and Scope of Work

The applicant will submit a scope of work that describes the project in detail.

#### **Promotion Plan**

If applicable, the proposal will include a detailed description of the plan to advertise, publicize and distribute information related to the project.

## Schedule/Timeline

The scope of work will include a timeline indicating when each element will be undertaken and completed. Projects are expected to be completed during the funding year. It is within the City Council's discretion to revoke the funding if funds are not expended within the funding year without proper explanation.

#### Budget

The project will include both income and expense categories; all income (including in-kind) will be broken out by amount, source and eligible expenses will be itemized.

#### Insurance

As part of its contract for performance, the City requires contractors to maintain liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate coverage.

Where automobiles are used in conjunction with the performance of this agreement, throughout the life of this Agreement the Contractor and its Subcontractors shall, at their own expense, maintain automobile liability insurance with a carrier licensed to do business in the state of Washington and with minimum coverage as follows: Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance, \$1,000,000 each occurrence or combined single limit coverage of \$1,000,000.

General Liability insurance and, if applicable, automobile liability insurance coverage shall be provided under a comprehensive general and automotive liability form of insurance, such as is usual to the practice of the insurance industry, including, but not limited to all usual coverage referred to as Personal Injury including coverage A, B, and C. If applicable, automobile liability insurance shall include coverage for owned, non-owned, leased or hired vehicles.

The City of Goldendale shall be named as an additional insured on all policies except automobile insurance and all such insurance as is carried by the Contractor shall be primary over any insurance carried by the City of Goldendale. The Contractor shall provide a certificate of insurance

#### Reimbursement

The City intends to enter into cost reimbursement contracts.

# Reporting

When the project is complete, applicants will complete and return a *Final Event/Project Report* with original receipts and documentation for reimbursement. State law, under RCW 67.28.1816, requires that local jurisdictions receiving Lodging Tax revenues must submit an annual economic impact report.

#### **Selection Process**

After applications are submitted to the Event Committee, they will be reviewed and evaluated by committee members and staff for eligibility, quality of proposal, and consideration of the project/event. Applicants may be contacted to provide clarification, make corrections or supply additional information. Applications that do not meet the guidelines will be disqualified and returned.

Applicants may be requested to attend a meeting of the Event Committee or City Council. They will be notified of the date, time and meeting location.

#### Applicable Definitions from RCW 67.28.080

- (1) "Acquisition" includes, but is not limited to, siting, acquisition, design, construction, refurbishing, expansion, repair, and improvement, including paying or securing the payment of all or any portion of general obligation bonds, leases, revenue bonds, or other obligations issued or incurred for such purpose or purposes under this chapter.
- (2) "Municipality" means any county, city or town of the state of Washington.

- (3) "Operation" includes, but is not limited to, operation, management, and marketing.
- (4) "Person" means the federal government or any agency thereof, the state or any agency, subdivision, taxing district or municipal corporations thereof other than county, city or town, any private corporation, partnership, association, or individual.
- (5) "Tourism" means economic activity resulting from tourists, which may include sales of overnight lodging, meals, tours, gifts, or souvenirs.
- (6) "Tourism promotion" means activities and expenditures designed to increase tourism, including but not limited to advertising, publicizing, or otherwise distributing information for the purpose of attracting and welcoming tourists; developing strategies to expand tourism; operating tourism promotion agencies; and funding marketing of special events and festivals designed to attract tourists.
- (7) "Tourism-related facility" means real or tangible personal property with a usable life of three or more years, or constructed with volunteer labor, and used to support tourism, performing arts, or to accommodate tourist activities.
- (8) "Tourist" means a person who travels from a place of residence to a different town, city, county, state, or country, for purposes of business, pleasure, recreation, education, arts, heritage, or culture.
