### **PUBLIC HEARING**

Parking on East Collins by Mayor Dave Jones - The Council recommended eliminating parking or consider allowing parking on the south side of Collins or allowing parking on the south side of Collins with extended sight distant from the corner of the intersection on East Collins between the Roosevelt intersection and Sanders Way. They also recommend turning the intersection of Roosevelt and Collins into a four-way stop.

Lee Eikanas – 809 E. Collins – Would like to know why this has come up

**Rosie Luna** -730 E. Collins - Has the hospital been asked to have their employees park in their parking lot

**Todd Nunn** – 714 E. Collins - Hospital should have their employees park in their parking lot

Lee Eikanas – 809 E. Collins – Has anyone looked into the business being ran in a residential neighborhood maybe that's why there are so many vehicles out there. I would like the police department to see if all the cars are registered and insured. In Ellensburg next to the college where parking is difficult, they give out placards to the community to be placed in cars that are in the residential permit zone if there is no placard the car is towed.

**Tim Bradford** – Allison Way – If you move cars and make more room on the road then cars will speed.

**Mark Sigfrinius** – 708 E. Collins – Against putting up a stop sign it will cause more noise, and the hospital employee should use their own parking lot

Bob Kindler - E. Collins - Against taking away parking on the South side of the road

**Priscilla Sigfrinius** – 708 E. Collins – Against no parking in front of the houses and the hospital employees should be parking in their own lot

**Chase Ogden** - 718 E. Collins – Is in favor of a four-way stop to slow down the traffic that speed down that road and is against eliminating parking on the South side of the road

**Larry Hoctor** - Allison Way— In favor of a four-way stop and believes the no parking should continue to the city limit line

**Lee Eikanas** – 809 E. Collins – If you're going to have no parking on a portion of the road the problem will work its way down the street so if you're going to have no parking on part of the street you should have no parking on all of the street

**Betty Aparicio** – Elm Dr – If you are going to have no parking on part of the street then continue it all the way and is in favor of a four-way stop

Tim Bradford – Allison Way – Is against a four-way stop

**Betty Richards** – Court St – Is in favor of a four-way stop

Larry Hoctor – Allison Way – Is that a designated truck route with rules and regulations

Todd Nunn - 714 E. Collins - All my vehicles are legal, and my business is legal

Larry Hoctor - Allison Way - Todd does park his truck out of the way

**Priscilla Sigfrinius** 708 E. Collins – Take into consideration the 3 to 4 people that live in this area that this will inconvenience

### **DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

**Fire Chief Noah Halm** – Hopefully in the next couple weeks we will get the decals on the Air Van. We are gearing up for wildland season there is a lot of training going on for that

**Police Chief Mike Smith** – In the Month of March we had 268 calls and 12 arrests. We are up 46 calls for suspicious activity.

City Administrator Sandy Wells – On the Southwest side of town there's around 24 streetlights that went out we think it might have been a power surge during the lightening. We are checking with PUD to get that resolved

### **COUNCIL BUSINESS**

**Parking on East Collins by Mayor Dave Jones -** We just had the public hearing to discuss the parking options. The next step is to make a motion tonight regarding the parking options on East Collins or make a motion to refer it back to the Public Works Committee for recommendations to the council.

**Council Member Andy Halm** – I do not agree with taking the parking away I feel the safest thing is to put the four-way stop in. I am disappointed the hospital is not here to discuss this with us. It seems like a big part of the problem is because of their employees and I think they should address that. Another idea is on the North side to do no parking from 8am until 5pm

**Council Member Miland Walling** – I like the idea of no parking on the North side. The four-way stop sign could be debated. Do we have any more of the reader boards to set out there to slow down the traffic

Chief Mike Smith — No we do not have any we would need to purchase some. I propose a four-way stop to slow people down coming into the school zone

Council Member Danielle Clevidence – I agree with everything that Andy said except I think that having the placards for the household would be good except that doesn't account for their visitors. I think we shouldn't take parking away if there is parking that is illegal there for line of sight then it should be specifically marked, monitored and ensured so that people are safe. A four-way stop would be helpful

**Council Member Steve Johnston** – This whole subject has come about over safety simple and pure and its called line of sight. The hospital needs to be put on notice in regards to this.

Council Member Loren Meagher – The public hearing was to not come to a conclusion tonight but to get the input from the community to take back and think about

it and come up with some possible solutions to address increasing safety with having minimal impact to the residents.

**Motion:** I would move that we take this back I think it would be the Ordinance Committee or Public Works Committee, Public Works Committee with all the input that we received tonight have some further discussion and see where that goes from there **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Loren Meagher, **Seconded by** Council Member Ellie Casey

**Council Member Danielle Clevidence** – I would like to have some input from the hospital on what their possible solutions on having the employees not park in those areas

**Council Member Loren Meagher** – If we have public parking available then it is available to any member of the public which includes the hospital employees so the only way to really mitigate that is limit parking to local residents or a certain time frame

Tim Bradford - would like paperwork on why the signs were removed on Collins

City Administrator Sandy Wells – The signs broke, and the system was outdated

Hearing Examiner Services Contract by Mayor Dave Jones -. We went out to bid and received one contract back. The contract was reviewed by our Attorney Quinn Plant and his recommendation was this was a fair contract. They have a flat rate for specified permits / applications plus an hourly rate for appeals.

**Motion:** I move to authorize the mayor to execute a professional services contract with Laminar Law, PLLC for hearing examiner services for the period April 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Danielle Clevidence, **Seconded by** Council Member Ellie Casey Motion Passed Unanimously

**2025 Pavement Preservation Project Award by Dustin Conroy** – There were 7 bids that were submitted. Dustin recommends that we award the contract to Tommer Construction Company. The city received roughly a million dollars from TIB so there might be an opportunity to add one more street to that.

**Motion:** I move to award the 2025 Pavement Preservation Project to Tommer Construction Company Inc in the amount of \$722,533.60, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Ellie Casey, **Seconded by** Council Member Andy Halm Motion Passed Unanimously

**2025 Phase 2 Water Line Improvement Project Award by Dustin Conroy** – The city received 5 bids for that project. It is recommended that we award the contract to Ajax Northwest, they were a little bit over our total amount. We believe that with the city funds that are in the water budget there is enough money to do the entire project. If something comes up that is more expensive than we think we may have to remove one portion of this project.

**Motion:** I move to award the 2025 phase 2 of the waterline improvement project to Ajax Northwest in the amount of \$1,384,404.35, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Danielle Clevidence, **Seconded by** Council Member Ellie Casey Motion Passed Unanimously

Council Member Theone Wheeler joined the meeting at 6:52pm

**Council Member Steve Johnston** – What is the timeline on the Preservation Project

**Dustin Conroy** – They have 30 days

**Council Member Loren Meagher** – Would like city staff to work with the contractors and Dustin to provide advanced notice to the residences so they can be better prepared than what we experienced last year
