DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Police Chief Michael Smith – We had 325 Calls of Service in May bringing the years total to 1445. The Flock cameras should be working soon. There are some issues with the Cop Grant that we are looking into

Fire/EMS Captain Julianna Ontiveros – The burn ban went into effect today. We are pump and ladder testing. Engine 6112 did not pass the test we are waiting to get more information on why it failed

City Administrator Sandy Wells – The house on Railroad that had a fire a couple years ago the new owner just filed for a demolition permit. The trees on Broadway and Mill are down

Mayor Dave Jones – I had a couple updates from our Ordinance meeting last week we met with Rick Lundin in regards to the suggested airport fees. We should have a recommended

Ordinance for that at the next meeting. The Ordinance committee is also working on a Resolution recommendation for a .1% sales tax for public safety.

COUNCIL BUSINESS

Master Interlocal Service agreement with Southwest WA Regional Transportation Council by Mayor Dave Jones – In January 2025, the Southwest Washington Regional Transportation Council (RTC) learned about a grant opportunity and submitted an application. The City of Goldendale identified a need to improve sidewalk conditions and pedestrian connectivity within the city right of way. This project aims to address those concerns by improving accessibility and walkability through better data and informed planning. With support from the grant, the City of Goldendale will collect detailed information about sidewalk widths, surface issues, and barriers to pedestrian travel. This data will be added to the statewide OS-CONNECT dataset and used by local leaders to prioritize future sidewalk improvements. As the seat of Klickitat County, Goldendale currently lacks verified information on its sidewalks – this project will help fill that gap.

Adam Fiss with RTC – discussed how the Grant works that it is a mapping exercise for the sidewalks and that they will be assisting the city through the process.

2025 West Darland St Reconstruction Project Award by Dustin Conroy - Dustin Conroy gave his recommendation to award Crestline Construction Company, LLC for the 2025 West Darland Street Reconstruction Project.

Motion: I move to award the 2025 West Darland St reconstruction Project to Crestline Construction Company LLC in the amount of \$857,979.93, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Loren Meagher, **Seconded by** Council Member Miland Walling Motion Passed Unanimously

Memorandum of Understanding with Klickitat County for Incubator Space Improvements by Mayor Dave Jones - The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to provide funding to the City of Goldendale for work associated with the Infrastructure Improvements to the Goldendale Incubator Space. Compensation to the City of Goldendale from the Klickitat County Point 09 funding is reimbursement basis for an amount not to exceed \$116,693.00.

Motion: I move to approve a memorandum of understanding with Klickitat County to receive point-09 revenue in the amount of \$116,693.00, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Loren Meagher, **Seconded by** Council Member Steve Johnston Motion Passed Unanimously

Broadway Parking Update by Mayor Dave Jones - The Public Works Committee is continuing to identify and evaluate alternatives to address public safety concerns, snow plowing issues, and street sweeping limitations to determine the best solution for this primary transportation corridor. The City will work to identify the intersections and areas on West Broadway where curb setbacks need to be painted to improve line of sight issues in accordance with current city ordinances.

Council Member Loren Meagher – Thanked the mayor for all his hard work on the Broadway Parking issue

Council Member Miland Walling – Asked if in front of the museum that a bus could still be allowed to park on the North side during certain hours.

Corley McFarland with Precision Approach Engineering – We will finish up the wetland delineation and get the design done to see the ultimate impacts. We are somewhere around an acre of wetland impact. The goal will be to mitigate that offsite

Corley McFarland with Precision Approach Engineering – The runway will be widened to 60 ft wide which is in compliance with the FFA standards also in conjunction with that move the runway lighting out so its compatible wit the new runway width. Provide shoulders and a runway safety area that meets FFA standards.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON, PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON AUGUST 5, 2025 OF A PROPOSITION AUTHORIZING AN INCREASE TO THE SALES AND USE TAX IN GOLDENDALE OF ONE-TENTH OF ONE PERCENT (0.1%) ON THE SELLING PRICE TO MAINTAIN FUNDING FOR POLICE SERVICES AND FIRE SERVICES; SETTING FORTH THE TEXT OF THE BALLOT PROPOSITION; DIRECTING PROPER CITY OFFICIALS TO TAKE NECESSARY ACTION; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER PROPERLY RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the safety, health, and welfare of the residents and businesses of the City of Goldendale require that the City provide an adequate level of police and fire services; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is vial to ensure there is appropriate funding for police and fire services; and

WHEREAS, the residents of the City have clearly indicated that ensuring police and fire services, including appropriate funding, are critical priorities; and

WHEREAS, RCW 82.14.450 authorizes the City to impose an additional sales tax for criminal justice and fire protection purposes within the City, to be shared between the City and Klickitat County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 82.14.450, at least one third of the moneys collected under the proposed sales and use tax must be used for criminal justice purposes, fire protection purposes, or both; and

WHEREAS, the intent of the City Council is that all revenue retained by the City from this additional sales tax be used by the City solely for criminal justice and fire protection purposes; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide funding to maintain criminal justice, public safety, and fire protection services in the City, it is deemed necessary and advisable for the City of Goldendale to impose an additional local sales and use tax of one tenth of one percent (0.1%) as authorized by RCW 82.14.450.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Goldendale, Klickitat County, Washington, the Council hereby requests the Klickitat County Auditor to place the following proposition on the November 4, 2025, ballot for the citizens of Goldendale's consideration.
