Council Member Steve Johnston – Would like to discuss establishing a schedule for our committee meetings. The public works committee is having trouble getting all 3 members to agree to a date and time. I would suggest picking one day a month to meet when that date comes up if there is nothing on the agenda then cancel the meeting and it should not have to have all 3 members present to have the meeting

Council Member Danielle Clevidence – I don't know how feasible it would be for every single committee, but if it could help your committee then why don't you guy just do that in your committee

Mayor Dave Jones – An important thing to remember about the committee's is their intended purposes are to provide recommendations to the full council that is why we have 3 person committees. That's why I feel it's a good idea to have all committee members at a committee meeting because they are providing a 3 person recommendation

Council Member Ellie Casey – The town looks really nice with the Christmas decorations

Council Member Andy Halm – We should wear ugly sweaters at the next council meeting like last year

Council Member Danielle Clevidence – Last year after we got back from Lacy and the legislative session, we talked about seeing if the department had anything they wanted to give to us by the end of

this year that way we can do research on it, if they have bills, they want us to fight for. I would like to see the departments come up with a little short yes on this or no on this

Council Member Miland Walling – Look forward to the new speakers working for the holidays. The airport committee has accomplished a lot and are working with the congressional delegation to get more support from them

Rick Lundin – We are in the process of solving the beacon light issue we got the bulbs ordered so it should be fixed soon. Thank you for passing the ordinances, it will make a big difference

Mayor Dave Jones – The Christmas Parade will be Saturday December 13th at 5pm there will be all the traditional activities that take place during that. The city ordinance says that the city council is in charge of deciding who is on what committees. Once the new council members come in January, I would like you to think about what committee you would like to be on. The traffic safety committee met last week with a recommendation to have a public hearing regarding changing the speed limit on 21st Street. That's one of the good things about being in this position is we are open to the public to come to us to express their concerns



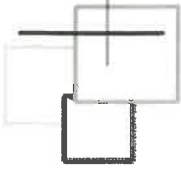

Each year Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) Aviation's Airport Aid Program provides crucial financial assistance to many of Washington State's public-use airports to address pavement, safety, planning, maintenance, runway safety and security needs. We would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the City of Goldendale (herein called the "Sponsor") on your Airport Aid grant award.

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has submitted to WSDOT Aviation an Airport Aid Application (herein called the "Application") dated April 19, 2024, for a grant of state funds for a project at or associated with Goldendale Municipal Airport (herein called the "Airport") which Application, as approved by WSDOT Aviation, is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, WSDOT Aviation has approved a project for the Airport (herein called the "Project") consisting of the following:

- Runway 7-25 RSA and Pavement Widening - Phase 1 Design, including eligible items as of July 1, 2025; all as more particularly described in the Application.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of RCW 47.68.090, *Aid to municipalities, Indian tribes, persons*, and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances contained in said Application and its acceptance of this Offer as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to Washington State and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and compliance with the assurances and conditions as herein provided, WSDOT Aviation, for and on behalf of the State of Washington, hereby offers and agrees to pay, as the state's share of the allowable costs incurred in accomplishing the Project, ninety-five (95) percent of all allowable Project costs, up to a maximum amount of \$71,250.00.

This Offer is made on and subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1) The maximum obligation of the State of Washington payable under this Offer shall be Seventy-One Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$71,250.00).
- 2) The allowable costs of the project shall not include any costs determined by WSDOT Aviation to be ineligible.
- 3) Payment of the state's share of the allowable project costs will be made pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of such regulations and procedures as the Secretary shall prescribe.
- 4) The Sponsor shall carry out and complete the Project without undue delay and in accordance with the terms hereof, and such regulations and procedures as the Secretary shall prescribe and agrees to comply with the assurances which were made part of the Application.
- 5) WSDOT Aviation reserves the right to amend or withdraw this Offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.
- 6) This offer shall expire, and State of Washington shall not be obligated to pay any part of the costs of the Project unless this Offer has been accepted by the Sponsor on or before Friday, December 12, 2025, or such subsequent date as may be prescribed in writing by WSDOT Aviation.
- 7) The State of Washington shall not be responsible or liable for damage to property or injury which may arise from, or be incident to, compliance with the grant agreement.
- 8) WSDOT Aviation reserves the right to terminate the agreement at any time because of legal matters detrimental to the state or the local government, insufficient funds held by WSDOT Aviation to complete the Project, or by mutual consent between the City of Goldendale and WSDOT Aviation. WSDOT Aviation will be responsible only for the state's proportionate share of the actual Project costs incurred at the time of any such termination and reserves the right to adjust the Grant amount through a supplemental agreement if the final engineer's cost estimate differs from the original cost estimate used to establish the Grant award.

If you accept this allocation, you will be required to supply WSDOT Aviation with monthly copies of billings and costs for this Project. Failure to supply these copies may slow down and possibly jeopardize your reimbursement. WSDOT Aviation must be able to review your records on this Project at any time for future audit purposes.

WSDOT Aviation expects the project to be completed by the date indicated on the submitted project schedule. Any modifications to the schedule will need to be submitted to WSDOT Aviation with an explanation and schedule revision. All modifications must be approved by WSDOT Aviation in writing prior to making any changes. The Washington State Legislature has appropriated funding for WSDOT's Airport Aid Program for the 2025 – 2027 biennium ending on June 30, 2027. Any airport's failure to

complete a project in a timely manner potentially affects funding of the entire Washington State aviation system.

The airport must remain open for the expected life of Twenty (20) years, otherwise 100% of the grant funding must be returned within Thirty (30) days of closure, sale or discontinuance of service.

The Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and ratification and adoption of the Application incorporated herein shall be evidenced by execution of this instrument by the Sponsor, as hereafter provided, and this Offer and Acceptance shall comprise an agreement with respect to the accomplishment of the Project and compliance with the assurances and conditions as provided herein. THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2025, between the STATE OF WASHINGTON, acting by and through the Aviation Division, Department of Transportation, (hereinafter the "STATE") and the above named Public Entity, (hereinafter the "PUBLIC ENTITY").

WHEREAS, the Public Entity has submitted to the State for Subvention of the Washington Airport Aid Program for (acquisition and/or development) of the Goldendale Municipal Airport together with the plans and specifications for such project, which project application has been approved by the State and is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof;

WHEREAS, the State has approved a project for development of the airport consisting of the following described airport development:

GCC 1040	\$71,250.00 - Runway 7-25 RSA and Pavement Widening - Phase 1
GOL-01-24	Design, including eligible items as of July 1, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the State Act, and in consideration of the (a) Public Entity's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances contained in said project application, and its acceptance of this offer as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the State of Washington and the public from the accomplishment of the project and the operation and maintenance of the airport as herein provided, the State hereby agrees to pay as its allowable costs incurred in accomplishing the project.

The terms and conditions of this grant agreement are as follows:

The maximum obligation of the State payable under this grant shall be 71,250.

The Public Entity shall:

1. Deposit in an Aviation Fund for said airport, at least \$ 3,750 to match the State's participation in said project.
2. Carry out and complete the project in accordance with the plans and specifications and property map, incorporated herein, as they may be revised or modified with the approval of the state.
3. In connection with the acquisition of real property for the project, the Public Entity shall secure at least two written appraisals by competent, experienced appraisers who are members of a recognized professional appraisal organization and shall not pay in excess of the highest appraisal without the written consent of the state except as otherwise directed by a court of competent jurisdiction after contested trial and judgment not resulting from an agreement between the parties.

4. No state funds will be paid to the Public Entity in any case until it certifies in writing that it has Aviation Funds for said airport in an amount equal to the state's participation, or the amount designated in paragraph (1) above, which deposited amount will be used solely for the purpose in question.
5. The Public Entity agrees to hold said airport open to the flying public during the useful life of the facilities developed under this project; that no exclusive operating or use agreements shall be granted to any person, company, or corporation; that failure to abide by such agreement shall automatically obligate the immediate and full return of all State of Washington money expended in behalf of the project to the State of Washington with reasonable interest. Further, the Public Entity agrees to keep the facility open during the useful life of the project or for a stated term of years, whichever is longer, as determined by the Aviation Division.
6. The Public Entity will make no charge to the State or its agencies for a limited, but reasonable, amount of state agency use or for state activity in search and rescue. And, further, RCW 47.68 is followed to best serve the public.

The allowable cost of the project shall not include any cost determined by the State to be ineligible for consideration as to allowability.

The State reserves the right to amend or withdraw this offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Public Entity.

This offer shall expire and the State shall not be obligated to pay any part of the costs of the project unless this agreement has been accepted by the Public Entity on such subsequent date as are prescribed in writing by the State, in the approval letter for each project.

Except for those projects receiving both state and federal aid, the following inspection scheduled, and reporting system will be required:

- A. Inspection Schedule and Reporting system will vary for each project. Basically, the inspection schedule will be placed on a quarterly basis. On project taking less than three (3) months, the Public Entity will be required to make reports and be inspected on the following schedule:
 1. Public Entity project commencement date.
 2. Public Entity report project completion date and request final inspection.
 3. State will make final inspection and sign-off project as completed.
 4. State will arrange for audit of account in accordance with regularly scheduled audit program.
- B. Projects taking over three (3) months will be set up on a quarterly inspection and progress report system. The Public Entity will be required to make reports and be inspected on the following schedule:
 1. Report project commencement date.
 2. Public Entity will make a three (3) months progress report. This will be a letter report giving percentage of project completed, fund expenditures to date, and short narrative of the project progress, problems encountered and plans for project completion.
 3. State will make quarterly project inspections and prepare the report of inspection. A copy of the report will be delivered to the Public Entity.
 4. Public Entity will make report of completion of project and request final inspection.
 5. State will make final inspection and sign-off as completed.
 6. State will arrange for audit of account in accordance with regularly scheduled audit program.

It should be made clear that a violation of any of the terms of the Grant Agreement will leave the State free to choose among one or more of the following remedies:

- A. The withholding of any future airport aid, and/or
- B. The return of grant funds awarded as an action for specific performance, and/or
- C. Enforcement of the commitment made by the applicant.

The Public Entity's acceptance of this offer and ratification and adoption of the project application incorporated herein shall be evidenced by execution of this instrument by the Public Entity, as hereafter provided, and said offer and acceptance shall comprise allocation agreement, constituting the obligation and rights of the State and the Public Entity with respect to the accomplishment of the project and the operation and maintenance of the airport. ORDINANCE NO. 1551

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE,
WASHINGTON ADOPTING GOLDENDALE MUNICIPAL
CODE CHAPTER 3.29 PUBLIC SAFETY SALES TAX**

WHEREAS, the City of Goldendale passed Resolution 747 to place a public safety sales tax of 0.1% on the November 4, 2025, ballot; and

WHEREAS, the voters approved the public safety sales tax; and

WHEREAS, the Klickitat County Auditor certified the election results on Nov. 4, 2025

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE,
WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. There is hereby adopted a new Goldendale Municipal Code Chapter 3.29, Public Safety Sales Tax, to read as follows:

3.29.010 - Imposed.

There is imposed a Public Safety Sales Tax, as authorized by RCW 82.14.450, as now adopted and hereafter amended, upon every taxable event, as defined in RCW 82.14.020, as now adopted and hereafter amended, occurring within the city. The tax shall be imposed upon and collected from those persons from who the state sales or use tax is collected pursuant to RCW Chapters 82.08 and 82.12, as now adopted and hereafter amended.

3.29.020 - Rate.

The rate of tax imposed by GMC 3.29.010 shall be one-tenth of one percent of the selling price or value of the article used, as the case may be; provided, however, the County shall receive 15 percent of the tax imposed by GMC 3.29.010.

3.29.030 - Administration and collection.

The administration and collection of the tax imposed by this chapter shall be in accordance with the provisions of RCW 82.14.450, as now adopted and hereafter amended.

3.29.040 - Disposition of money collected pursuant to BMC 3.29.

Money received according to this Chapter shall be deposited in the general (current expense) fund for the express purpose of funding police and fire services. As defined in RCW 82.14.340 at least one-third of revenues must be used for public safety purposes.

3.29.050 - Inspection of records.

The City hereby consents to the inspection of such records as are necessary to qualify the City for inspection of records of the Department of Revenue, pursuant to RCW 82.32.330, as now adopted and hereafter amended.

3.29.060 - Authorizing contractor for administration.

The mayor and clerk are authorized to enter into a contract with the Department of Revenue for the administration of the public safety sales tax imposed by GMC 3.29.010, pursuant to RCW 82.14.050, as now adopted and hereafter amended.

3.29.070 - Referendum petition procedures.

Referendum petition procedures to repeal a city tax as authorized under RCW 82.14.030(2), as now adopted and hereafter amended, shall comply with RCW 82.14.036, as now adopted and hereafter amended, as well as RCW 35A.11.100, as now adopted and hereafter amended.

3.29.080 - Penalties.

Any seller who fails or refuses to collect the tax as required with the intent to violate the provisions of this chapter or to gain some advantage or benefit, either direct or indirect, and any buyer who refuses to pay any tax due under this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 2. The City Clerk is directed to provide a copy of this ordinance to the Department of Revenue.

Section 3. The public safety sales tax adopted by this ordinance shall take effect on April 1, 2026, per RCW 82.14.055.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect 5 days after its passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1553

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE,
WASHINGTON AMENDING GOLDENDALE MUNICIPAL
CODE SECTION 8.12.040 TO ADOPT THE KLICKITAT
COUNTY NOXIOUS WEED LIST AS THE CITY OF
GOLDENDALE NOXIOUS WEED LIST**

WHEREAS, as presently drafted, Goldendale Municipal Code (“GMC”) Section 8.12.040 requires the City to maintain a list of weeds designated as “noxious, offensive and intolerable”; and

WHEREAS, the City does not currently maintain the list required by GMC 8.12.040 and has not maintained such a list for several years; and

WHEREAS, the Klickitat County Noxious Weed Board was established by Klickitat County for the purpose of administering Chapter 17.10 RCW, Noxious Weeds – Control Boards; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to authority vested in the Klickitat County Noxious Weed Board pursuant to Ch. 17.10 RCW, the Klickitat County Noxious Weed Board adopts on an annual basis a Klickitat County Noxious Weed List; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to adopt the Klickitat County Noxious Weed List as it currently exists and will be amended in the future as the City of Goldendale Noxious Weed List;

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE,
WASHINGTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Goldendale Municipal Code Section 8.12.070, Noxious weed list, which currently reads as follows:

8.12.040 Noxious weed list.

A noxious weed list shall be maintained by the city which shall designate certain weeds as noxious, offensive and intolerable. The noxious weed list may be changed from time to time by council resolution. It is the intent to cooperate with other governmental weed control agencies as well as to establish a weed control plan for Goldendale.

IS HEREBY AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

8.12.040 Noxious weed list.

The Klickitat County Noxious Weed List as prepared and issued on an annual basis by the Klickitat County Noxious Weed Board is hereby adopted as the City of Goldendale Noxious Weed List. It is the intent to cooperate with other governmental weed control agencies as well as to establish a weed control plan for Goldendale.

Section 2. Except as amended herein, Chapter 8.12 of the Goldendale Municipal Code is affirmed and unchanged.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take force and be in effect five (5) days from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 1554

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON AMENDING GOLDENDALE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 8.45.070 TO DESIGNATE THE OCCUPANCY OF A RECREATION VEHICLE ANYWHERE WITHIN THE CITY EXCEPT A PERMITTED RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARK FOR A PERIOD OF TIME IN EXCESS OF 14 CONSECUTIVE DAYS OR THIRTY DAYS IN A CALENDAR YEAR A PUBLIC NUISANCE

WHEREAS, the City of Goldendale has codified its regulations concerning public nuisances at Chapter 8.45 of the Goldendale Municipal Code (“GMC”); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to update the provision of Chapter 8.45 GMC to clarify that the occupancy of a recreational vehicle within the City, except in a permitted recreational vehicle park, for a period of time in excess of 14 consecutive days or 30 days in a calendar year constitutes a public nuisance;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Goldendale Municipal Code Section 8.45.070, Types of nuisances, which currently reads as follows:

8.45.070 Types of nuisances.

It shall be a "public nuisance" within the city of Goldendale if any responsible person or persons shall maintain or allow to be maintained on real property which he or she may have charge, control or occupy, except as may be permitted by any other city ordinance, whether visible or not from any public street, alley or residence, any of the following conditions:

1. A nuisance defined by statute or ordinance.
2. A nuisance at common law, either public or private.
3. An attractive nuisance, whether in or on a building, a building premises or an unoccupied lot and whether realty, fixture or chattel, which might reasonably be expected to attract children of tender years and constitute a danger to them, including, but not limited to, abandoned wells, ice boxes or refrigerators with doors and latches including magnetic doors, shafts, basements or other excavations, abandoned or inoperative vehicles or other equipment, structurally unsound fences or other fixtures, lumber, fencing, vegetation or other debris.

4. Filthiness or that which is dangerous to human life or detrimental to health.
5. Any accumulation of material on a property including but not limited to animal matter, ashes, bottles, boxes, broken stone, building materials which are not properly stored or neatly piled, cans, cement, crates, empty barrels, dead animals or animal waste, glass, litter, mattresses or bedding, old appliances, equipment, vehicle or any parts thereof, furniture, iron or other scrap metal, packing cases, packing material, plaster, plastic, rags, wire, yard waste or debris or other objects which endanger property or public safety, or constitute a fire hazard or vermin habitat; provided, that nothing set forth in this chapter shall be construed to prevent the temporary retention of waste in approved, covered receptacles for no more than seven consecutive days; provided, further, nothing set forth in this chapter shall be construed to prevent the keeping or storage of building materials, iron or other scrap metal on private property which is screened from view (a structurally sound wooden fence or slatted chain link fence in an earth tone color) or within an enclosed building. This section does not apply to any property or situation where a development regulation applies.
6. Any wrecked, inoperable, abandoned or disassembled equipment, trailer, boat, tractor, automobile, recreation vehicle or any other vehicle, or any parts thereof. Evidence of abandonment includes, but is not limited to, all vehicles or vehicle bodies which have not been moved for a period of thirty days as evidenced by the vehicle being covered by moss, leaves, needles or other vegetation, or has grass or other vegetation growing up around the vehicle, or other circumstances exist so as to support a reasonable belief that the vehicle has not been moved for thirty days or more. This includes apparently inoperable, immobile, disassembled or extensively damaged vehicles. Evidence of inoperability and damage includes, but is not limited to, a buildup of debris that obstructs use, a broken window or windshield, a missing wheel, a flat tire, a nonfunctional motor, transmission or differential, missing bumpers or missing or expired license plates; provided, nothing set forth in this chapter shall be construed to prevent the keeping or storage of any vehicle on private property, outside the building line for the front yard or side yard flanking a street, which is screened from a street/alley view by a structurally sound wooden fence or slatted chain link fence in an earth tone color or within an enclosed building. This section does not apply to any property or situation where a development regulation applies. Also, the section does not apply to one project vehicle on which the owner is working for no more than one thirty-day period.
7. Any vehicles or recreational vehicles parked, stored or kept outside of the designated driveway, within a residential use, provided nothing set forth in

this section shall be construed to prevent the keeping or storage of any vehicle on private property, outside the building line for the front yard or side yard flanking a street, which is screened from view by a structurally sound wooden fence or slatted chain link fence, in an earth tone color or within an enclosed building. Where a property address has more than one driveway, the vehicles may only be parked in one driveway in the area between the front of the residence or principal structure and the lot front line.

- 8 Vegetation. Vegetation left cut and/or in an unkempt stage may cause safety hazards, fire hazards, and/or pest harborages, and may interfere with, annoy, injure or endanger the comfort, repose, health or safety of others, or unlawfully interferes with, obstructs or tends to obstruct, or render dangerous for passage, street or highway; or in any way render other persons insecure in life, or in the use and enjoyment of property, thus constituting a public nuisance.
- a. Any tree which is in danger of falling and creates a substantial risk of damage or injury is declared to be a public nuisance.
 - b. Trees, plants, bushes, shrubs, vines, other vegetation or parts thereof which overhang any sidewalk, street, alley or other public way which are growing in such a manner as to cause a sight distance hazard or to obstruct or impair the full use of the sidewalk, street, alley or other public way are declared to be a public nuisance.
 - c. Trees, plants, bushes, shrubs, grasses, vines, other vegetation or parts thereof that are growing and/or grown and died and are now causing a fire hazard or menace to public health and safety, or are degrading or causing a decline of the character of the neighborhood are also declared to be a public nuisance.
 - d. Grasses (lawn) within the yards of all residential properties which are not maintained at a height of six inches or less are also declared to be a public nuisance.
 - e. Grasses, ground cover, and/or vines on vacant lots that are within or adjacent to developed areas which are not used for agricultural purposes, not wooded and are not part of a wetland or other sensitive environmental system, which are not maintained at a height of twelve inches or less are also declared to be a public nuisance.
 - f. Destroying or allowing no vegetation so as to create soil erosion or a dust control problem is declared to be a public nuisance.

drains, gutters, downspouts, and similar features shall be safely anchored.

- g. Roofs. The roof and flashings shall be maintained in good repair and be structurally sound, so as not to pose a threat to the public health, safety and welfare.

8.45.070 Types of nuisances.

This includes apparently inoperable, immobile, disassembled or extensively damaged vehicles. Where a property address has more than one driveway, the vehicles may only be parked in one driveway in the area between the front of the residence or principal structure and the lot front line.
8. Vegetation. Vegetation left cut and/or in an unkempt stage may cause safety hazards, fire hazards, and/or pest harborages, and may interfere with, annoy, injure or endanger the comfort, repose, health or safety of others, or unlawfully interferes with, obstructs or tends to obstruct, or render dangerous for passage, street or highway; or in any way render other persons insecure in life, or in the use and enjoyment of property, thus constituting a public nuisance.

- a. Any tree which is in danger of falling and creates a substantial risk of damage or injury is declared to be a public nuisance.
 - b. Trees, plants, bushes, shrubs, vines, other vegetation or parts thereof which overhang any sidewalk, street, alley or other public way which are growing in such a manner as to cause a sight distance hazard or to obstruct or impair the full use of the sidewalk, street, alley or other public way are declared to be a public nuisance.
 - c. Trees, plants, bushes, shrubs, grasses, vines, other vegetation or parts thereof that are growing and/or grown and died and are now causing a fire hazard or menace to public health and safety, or are degrading or causing a decline of the character of the neighborhood are also declared to be a public nuisance.
 - d. Grasses (lawn) within the yards of all residential properties which are not maintained at a height of six inches or less are also declared to be a public nuisance.
 - e. Grasses, ground cover, and/or vines on vacant lots that are within or adjacent to developed areas which are not used for agricultural purposes, not wooded and are not part of a wetland or other sensitive environmental system, which are not maintained at a height of twelve inches or less are also declared to be a public nuisance.
 - f. Destroying or allowing no vegetation so as to create soil erosion or a dust control problem is declared to be a public nuisance.
 - g. The duty to maintain property extends to and includes the area of the public right-of-way adjacent to and between the property of the person owning, leasing, renting, occupying, being in possession or having charge of the private property and the paved road.
9. The existence of any fence, other structure, or thing on private or public property abutting or fronting upon any public street, sidewalk or place, which is sagging, leaning, fallen, decayed or is otherwise dilapidated and creating an unsafe condition.
 10. Any vacant or abandoned residence that is or remains unoccupied or unused for ninety or more consecutive days shall meet the following minimum maintenance standards or be declared a nuisance:
 - a. Premises. The premises shall be clean, safe, and sanitary, free from waste, garbage, and excessive vegetation, and shall not pose a

threat to the public health, welfare, or safety. Effective measures shall be taken to protect against the breeding or presence on the premises of vermin. The premises or yard shall be maintained free from weeds and turf grasses in excess of six inches.

- b. **Building or Structure.** Building or structures shall be maintained in good repair and be structurally sound. Structural members shall be free of deterioration and shall be free from safety, health, and fire hazards, and shall not pose a hazard to public health, safety, and welfare.
- c. **Building Openings.** All doors, windows, and other openings shall be weather-tight and secured against entry by birds, vermin, and trespassers. Missing or broken doors, windows, and other openings shall be covered by glass, plywood, or other weather-resistant materials and tightly fitted and secured to the opening.
- d. **Foundation Walls.** Foundation walls shall be animal- and vermin-proof and be maintained in a structurally sound and sanitary condition so as not to pose a threat to the public health, safety and welfare.
- e. **Exterior Walls.** Exterior walls shall be free of holes, breaks, and loose or rotting materials. Exposed metal, wood, or other surfaces shall be protected from the elements and against decay or rust.
- f. **Exterior Features.** All chimneys, decks, balconies, canopies, awnings, exhaust ducts, cornices, corbels, trim, wall facings, drains, gutters, downspouts, and similar features shall be safely anchored.
- g. **Roofs.** The roof and flashings shall be maintained in good repair and be structurally sound, so as not to pose a threat to the public health, safety and welfare.

11. Occupancy of a recreational vehicle for any purposes anywhere in the City except in a recreational vehicle park maintained in accordance with all applicable state statutes and city ordinances for a period of time in excess of fourteen consecutive days or thirty days in a calendar year.

Section 2. Except as amended herein, Chapter 8.45 of the Goldendale Municipal Code is affirmed and unchanged.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take force and be in effect five (5) days from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law, subject to the provisions of Section 4 herein in the event of the filing of a referendum.
