DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Police Chief Mike Smith – The month of November we had 262 calls for service and 12 arrests. Year to date we have 3,542 calls for service. We have a couple people in the hiring process to get those positions filled. The grant has come through so we are working on the finalization of that

Building Official/Code Enforcement Officer Robert Thompson – This year we have 105 permits issued with total fees of \$55,720 last year there were 115 permits issues with fees totaling \$45,000. There were 4 new houses built, 2 factory-built structures, and 5 demos. Last

year we had 5 new homes built and 3 factory-built structures. There were 73 code enforcement cases this year compared to 43 cases last year. There were citations written this year totaling \$3,189 and 2 liens in the amount of \$13,609.50

Public Works Director Doug Frantum – I will probably be at the next meeting on zoom to give an update on how the year went. We have been doing some work on our transmission line above the chlorine station that will be going on through the end of the month. The treatment plant project is pretty close to closing that out. We did a walk through on Darland Street to show them the things that we want tidied up before winter shutdown. With the flooding on the west side of the mountains we have been going through our sewer systems that lie in the lowland and addressing those in case water hits us. We have been working with Aspect Consulting and RH2 on some issues that we are having with the well at the chlorine station and will be meeting with them to address the issues. I would like to thank Ellie and Miland for their service

Mayor Dave Jones – In January is the AWC City Action Days I would encourage you to check out the AWC website there is a lot of good information. I have reached out to all the department heads to look at the legislative agenda and any legislative bills that you see on the website that pertain to the city and let me know so we can discuss them when we meet with our legislators next month

COUNCIL BUSINESS

WSDOT Grant for Design of Airport Runway by Mayor Dave Jones- The City of Goldendale was awarded \$71,250.00 for phase 1 design for the Goldendale Airport pavement widening project with a match of \$3,750.00.

Council Member Danielle Clevidence – Which fund will this come from

Mayor Dave Jones – It will come out of the General Fund

Council Member Theone Wheeler – Was curious about the wording that states the Airport must remain open for the expected life of 20 years otherwise 100% of the grant funding must be returned within 30 days of closure

Mayor Dave Jones – They put that wording in there so that you don't take the money and do things then decide to use the airport for other things.

Motion: I move to authorize the mayor to enter into a Grant Agreement with the Washington State Department of Transportation, Project Number GCC1040 for Pavement Widening Phase 1 in the amount of \$71,250.00, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Danielle Clevidence, **Seconded by** Council Member Miland Walling.

Ord 1551- Chapter 3.29 Public Safety Sales Tax by Mayor Dave Jones - The City of Goldendale passed Resolution No 747 to place a safety sales tax of .01% on November 4, 2025, ballot. The voters approved the safety sales tax and were certified by the Klickitat County Auditor's office

Motion: I move to Adopt Ordinance No. 1551 adopting Goldendale Municipal Code Chapter 3.29 Public Safety Sales Tax and waive the second reading, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Danielle Clevidence, **Seconded by** Council Member Ellie Casey.

Ord 1553 – Section 8.12.0410 – Noxious Weed List - The ordinance committee met and discussed adding the Klickitat County Noxious Weed List to the Goldendale Municipal Code

Council Member Theone Wheeler – Would like Robert to go over the list to make sure there are no Native American Indigenous Plants on the noxious weeds list

Motion: I move to Adopt Ordinance No. 1553 amending Goldendale Municipal Code Section 8.12.040 to adopt the Klickitat County Noxious Weed List as the City of Goldendale Noxious Weed List and waive the second reading, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Danielle Clevidence, **Seconded by** Council Member Ellie Casey.
Motion Passed Unanimously

Ord 1554 – Section 8.45.070 – Recreation Vehicle by Mayor Dave Jones - The city desires to update the provision of Chapter 8.45 GMC (Goldendale Municipal Code) to clarify that the occupancy of a recreational vehicle within the city, except in a permitted recreational vehicle park, for a period more than 14 consecutive days or 30 days in a calendar year constitutes a public nuisance.

Building Official/Code Enforcement Officer Robert Thompson – This Chapter is already in the code it is just tucked away in an odd spot under yard buffers. It will remain under yard buffers, but it will also move to the nuisance code where it will be easier to enforce.

Council Member Danielle Clevidence – Concerned that if its in 2 different spots that if the Ordinance gets changed it might not get changed in both places it's listed in and that they will then contradict each other unless there is a way to make sure it's known that this Ord is listed in 2 different places

Building Official/Code Enforcement Officer Robert Thompson – The attorney is the one who advised us to do it this way

Motion: I move to Adopt Ordinance No. 1554 amending Goldendale Municipal Code Section 8.45.070 to designate the occupancy of a recreation vehicle anywhere within the city except a permitted recreational vehicle park for a period of time in excess of 14 consecutive days or thirty days in a calendar year a public nuisance and waive the second reading, **Action:** Motion, **Moved by** Council Member Danielle Clevidence, **Seconded by** Council Member Ellie Casey.
Motion Passed Unanimously

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Title 2. Administration and Personnel

Chapter 2.04. CITY COUNCIL

§ 2.04.075. Standing committees.

- A. Created. The following standing committees of the city council are created and established:
1. Finance;
 2. Ordinance;
 3. Public works;
 4. Event.
- B. Purpose. The purpose of each committee shall be to review matters within the following subject areas:
1. Finance Committee. The primary purpose of the finance committee is to review and advise the city council upon all matters involving financial affairs of the city, including the annual budget and amendments thereto, review of capital and financial planning, financial tracking and reports, and such other matters as may be assigned to this committee.
 2. Ordinance. The primary purpose of the ordinance committee is to review and advise the city council on all matters involving the amendment and preparation of new ordinances for the Goldendale Municipal Code and other such matters as may be assigned to the committee.
 3. Public Works. The primary purpose of the public works committee is to review and advise the city council upon all matters involving public utilities, including streets, storm drains, street lighting, water supply, treatment and distribution, wastewater treatment plant and collection system, and parks and other such matters as may be assigned to the committee.
 4. Event. The primary purpose of the event committee is to review and advise the city council upon all matters pertaining to tourism development and promotion.
- C. Term. The term and membership of each committee shall commence on the first regular meeting of the city council in January of every even year, and shall terminate effective the date prior to such meeting. The appointment to each council committee shall be made by the council during the first meeting of the council in January of every even year. No councilmember should serve on more than two committees at one time. The mayor shall be ex officio member of each committee.
- D. Duties and Responsibilities. The committees shall consider, review and make recommendations to the council concerning matters referred to them by the council. The mayor, committee chairpersons and boards and commissions are encouraged to suggest items to the council which should be considered by a committee.
- E. Committee Support. Respective department heads may attend council committee meetings to provide information, draft documents and other support as reasonably requested by the committee.

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this 1 day of ~~December~~ ^{January}, 2025 is by and between the Contractee, CITY OF GOLDENDALE, a Municipal Corporation located in the County of Klickitat, State of Washington, (hereinafter referred to as "City"); and Contractor, LANCE FITZJARRALD, dba Fitzjarrald Law Office, a Washington State LLC located in County of Klickitat, State of Washington (hereinafter referred to as "Attorney").

The parties recite and declare that:

City requires legal counsel to advise and represent City in all legal matters concerning enforcement of ordinances and adopted State criminal statutes:

Attorney or its agents are persons who, through education, experience, and professional qualifications possess the requisite skills to provide competent legal services for the City.

Attorney intends to perform the usual and accustomed duties of a Municipal Court Prosecuting Attorney, inter alia, reviewing, filing, and appearing on behalf of the City matters that concern serious traffic violations, dangerous dog enforcement, misdemeanors and gross misdemeanors.

City is, therefore, desirous of engaging the services of the Attorney for prosecution services for crimes over which the City has jurisdiction.

For the reasons set forth above and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises of the parties hereto, the City and Attorney agree as follows:

Section One
Purpose

City hereby employs Attorney to perform and render legal services to the City as its Prosecuting Attorney.

Section Two
Acceptance and Duration of Contract

City does hereby contract with and retain the Attorney for and during a period commencing on the 1st day of January, 2026, and ending on the 31st day of December, 2026, for the performance of legal services herein set forth.

Section Three
Place of Work

It is understood that the Attorney's service will be rendered largely at his office and in the City of Goldendale Municipal Court, East Klickitat District Court for the County of Klickitat, but that the Attorney will, on request, come to the Municipal Offices of the City, or City of Goldendale Police Department, or such other places as designated by the City, or such places as otherwise required in the performance of the contract.

City agrees to provide a private meeting room, from time to time, and accessible during business hours, suitable for interviews and the taking of depositions.

Section Four
Nature of Duties

As Prosecuting Attorney for the City, Attorney shall perform all criminal prosecution legal services required by law on behalf of the City; to wit, all misdemeanor and gross misdemeanor prosecution; serious traffic infraction enforcement; and, civil infraction enforcement for dangerous dogs.

The Attorney acknowledges that the City contracts with East Klickitat District Court to provide Municipal Court services and that the City abides the scheduling set by the the County Court.

The Attorney acknowledges that prosecution services may extend to higher courts within and without the City of Goldendale and may require travel and accommodations.

The Attorney shall be responsible for and carry out the usual and accustomed practices of a prosecuting attorney, namely, court filings, docketing, discovery, subpoenas as required to perform duties specified in Section Four paragraph 1.

Section Five
Fees & Compensation

The City agrees to pay the Attorney at the rate of Seven Thousand Six Hundred (\$7,600) Dollars per month, set fee, payable monthly, for the above listed services performed by the Attorney on the City's behalf.

Additional Fees -- Hourly

The City agrees to pay the Attorney an hourly rate in excess of advance fees, above, at Two Hundred Ninety Five (\$300) Dollars per hour after submitted invoicing for services rendered outside the contract, these fees may arise due to force majeure, change in legislation, or facts and circumstances outside the knowledge and control of the parties at the time this agreement was made;

Legal cases that extend beyond the termination of this contract that the Attorney is unable to withdraw from and is unable to substitute subsequent City Attorney to provide representation;

Responding to claims against the City and Higher Court review in Klickitat County Superior Court, appellate courts, and federal courts;

Responding to Public Disclosure Requests;

Responding to grievances and claims based in any part on prosecutor acts;

Any and all other legal advice or representation undertaken by the parties by subsequent agreement that is not addressed in this contract.

Additional Set Fee -- Criminal Trials

If a matter is set for a criminal trial and Attorney prepares for and appears at court to conduct a trial, or multi-day trial, the City agrees to pay the Attorney a set fee of One Thousand (\$1,000) dollars per day for trial time until the proceeding is concluded by court order or jury verdict.

Section Six Expenses

The City shall provide to Attorney and bear the cost of obtaining and generating nationwide criminal history reports and records created in the course of business for use by law enforcement and not generally available to the public.

The City shall bear the cost of retaining and consulting with specialists or expert witnesses needed for case preparation and prosecution. Payments shall be made by the City.

The City shall bear the cost of exhibits created for and used at trial.

The City shall bear the cost for travel expenses and accommodations for necessary witnesses.

Attorney travel expenses and accommodations shall be billed to the city per applicable federal government set rates for obligations more than 60 miles from the City.

Section Seven
Nature of Employment

The Attorney shall serve as an independent contractor of the City of Goldendale and shall not be employed by the City. Nothing precludes the Attorney or the City from entering into similar agreements and overlapping duties; provided they do not directly conflict with either party's ability to carry out the terms of this agreement.

Section Eight
Associate Attorney

City acknowledges that Attorney may need to associate with peers in the legal community to represent City. Where Attorney becomes unavailable due to conflict, calamity, or other unforeseeable event City agrees that Attorney may allow a colleague of Attorney's choosing to provide legal representation and share privileged information, as necessary.

Attorney bears the expense of employing associate counsel or conflict counsel.

Section Nine
Information Security

Attorney strives to protect client information but will not guaranty infallible security. City holds harmless, Attorney, for any unintended disclosure of information. City understands that Attorney does rely on third-parties to store client data. Absent an agreement to the contrary, Fitzjarrald Law Office will keep records and documents on or in private computers and private cloud storage accounts.

Section Ten
Termination

Either party may terminate this agreement at any time on sixty (60) days' written notice to the other party.

Section Eleven
Modification

No modification or waiver of this agreement or of any covenant, condition, or provision herein contained shall be valid unless in writing and duly executed by the party to be charged therewith.

Section Twelve
Indemnification & Licensing

The City shall indemnify, defend, and hold Attorney harmless against all claims, actions, and liability Attorney may hereafter incur with third parties while acting in the capacity of City Prosecutor and while acting within the scope of his representation of City.

Attorney will maintain private practice liability insurance and licensing to practice law.

Section Thirteen
File & Property Retention

Attorney will retain records typically for the period required by law. City must make any request for the return of any portion of the file and original documents or items held by Attorney within 30 days of termination of representation. Absent said request the contents of the file and personal items become the property of Fitzjarrald Law Office subject to destruction.

Section Fourteen
Withdrawal as Counsel at Termination of Contract

At the termination of the contract, nothing herein shall require nor prevent the Attorney from notifying the court and opposing counsel that Attorney is withdrawing as counsel for the City. The City should use best practices and timely notify the court and parties of any substitution of counsel.

Notice

- B. North Columbus from the bridge overpass for the Little Klickitat River to the north city limits.
- C. South Columbus from south city limits to Industrial Park Way.
- D. Bickleton Road from Broadway to the east city limits.
- E. Highway 142 (Broadway Street) from the east city limits to the west city limits.

IS HEREBY AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

10.12.020 Designated streets.

A. The designated speed limit on the following street(s) shall be thirty miles per hour:

- 1. Simcoe Drive from South Columbus Street to Highway 97.
- 2. North Columbus from the bridge overpass for the Little Klickitat River to the north city limits.
- 3. South Columbus from south city limits to Industrial Park Way.
- 4. Bickleton Road from Broadway to the east city limits.

5. Highway 142 (Broadway Street) from the east city limits to the west city limits.

B. The designated speed limit on the following street(s) shall be fifteen miles per hour:

1. 21st Street from S. Columbus Ave. to its terminus.
2. Jaxon Street from 21st Street to its terminus.
3. Chatfield Place from 21st Street to its terminus.
4. Benson Court from 21st Street to its terminus.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect 5 days after its passage and publication as required by law.
